## THE ACCIDENT REPORT: A VERY IMPORTANT DOCUMENT IN YOUR CASE

One of the most important liability documents in an FELA case is the **Accident Report**. The information that the injured railroader records will play a substantial role in determining whether the railroad provided a safe place to work and the direct impact on damages you will receive for your injuries.

- Don't let the railroad pressure you into reporting inaccurate facts
- Don't blame yourself where you are not to blame
- Be **specific** in identifying unsafe conditions
- Name Witnesses
- List all affected body parts
- Accurately, **but briefly**, describe the accident
- Less is more
- Beware of trick questions

How you fill out the report often determines the recovery you will receive for your injuries. Honestly and accurately use your own words not your supervisor's. Get a copy of a blank injury form. Review it the same way you review your rulebooks so that you are familiar with the questions. Contact your local chairman or Designated Counsel for guidance. <a href="Immediately">Immediately</a> call if you are being harassed and intimidated by railroad officials.
